

The "Little Jennie" is a bugeye ketch, a romantic piece of American sailing history, dating back to 1884. She was built as an oyster dragger. Now converted to a pleasure yacht she provides simple amenities with the most pleasurable kind of sailing, "with character".

Now fitted out to sleep six with a simple galley and two heads, ideal for a party of four to six for extended cruising. It can be stated that the "Little Jennie" is one of the most comfortable day sailors on the east coast. It is unusual that a vessel of this size can accommodate thirty persons or more and with a most desirable plus, she sails nearly upright with a stiff breeze.



We are flexible in the operation of the "Little Jennie" you can participate — from steering, hoisting the sails to cook and bottle washer or just take it easy. Your choice.

On board you will find the basics for fishing, a sunfish for more sailing, a dinghy with outboard. The captain and crew are certified skin and scuba divers. Snorkeling gear aboard, and the sparkling gin clear waters of the Bahamas in our back yard.
